DPS CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) UPDATE!

Dear PBA Parents,

We wanted to provide an update to our families and on how we are responding to Coronavirus (COVID-19) issues affecting our community. As of 7 p.m. Wednesday, March 11, there are no DPS students or staff who have tested positive for COVID-19.

COVID-19 UPDATE:

Confirmed COVID-19 cases in Colorado, per Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment: 33

 Confirmed COVID-19 cases in Denver County: 6, (plus one indeterminate case, which means the test did not provide conclusive results)

STATUS OF DPS SCHOOLS:

All DPS schools with the exception of Cory Elementary School will remain open on Thursday, March 12. Cory Elementary remains closed on March 12, out of an abundance of caution and following guidance from health officials, after a parent at the school tested positive on March 10 for COVID-19. We have thoroughly disinfected the school and are awaiting additional information from health officials before reopening the school.

STATUS OF DPS-SPONSORED TRAVEL:

There are rapidly changing conditions here in Colorado as well as across the nation related to the spread of COVID-19. Because of this, we have canceled until further notice all district-sponsored international and out-of-state travel for all students and staff. This was a very difficult decision, and the overriding priority – as always – was the health and safety of our students and staff. (More information is available here.)

STATUS OF DPS FACILITIES:

DPS has an established system to keep schools clean and minimize the spread of a virus. This includes a nightly disinfection of bathrooms, most of which are cleaned using pressure washers. We also conduct scheduled touch-surface cleanings throughout the week; these cleanings are increased if there is an illness outbreak at the school. Coronavirus is a respiratory illness, and with any respiratory or stomach illness outbreak at a school, DPS school nurses and school leaders use the DPS infectious disease outbreak process to track illnesses, notify health department officials, clean and disinfect schools, and notify staff and parents.

Dear Parents.

We will begin the Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS) assessments on March 16th, 2020. These assessments focus on the knowledge and skills our kids need for success in our global economy, including skills such as analytical thinking and the ability to solve complex problems. The CMAS assessments focus on four different content areas depending upon the grade your child is in:

- English Language Arts (ELA) and Math 3rd, 4th, 5th grade
 Spanish Language Arts (CLSA) 3rd and 4th grade Spanish speaking students
- Social Studies 4th grade
- Science 5th grade

We want to help parents and families with information to support student success during this time. These assessments will give our teachers critical information to help our students be on track for college and career readiness and help us understand whether our students have the necessary skills to succeed after high school.

Testing Schedule: The attached testing schedule was created to communicate to you when the CMAS assessments are occurring. We ask parents and families to ensure their children get plenty of sleep and a healthy breakfast every day, but especially on assessment days. In addition, if there are doctor's appointments or other appointments that need to be made, we hope this calendar will help you to make those appointments on non-assessment days.

Attendance: We also want to communicate that all students should be in schoobn-time, all day and every day, regardless of whether assessments are occurring or not. Important teaching and learning happens in between testing, so it is imperative that students are here. Our expectations remain around vacations and we expect parents to continue to plan vacations around the DPS calendar.

Make-Ups: Students do best when they are in their classroom environment for testing. In the event that your child has to miss a test session, they will have to make up the test another time and will be pulled during their instructional time to do so. In addition, due to our teachers needing to teach during all nontesting days, our paraprofessionals are used to give make-ups, which pulls them from supporting the classroom. To prevent disruption to your child's and other student's day, please make sure that your child is at school every day and limit their absences to only when they are sick.

We appreciate your support during this time. Assessments, including CMAS as well as those taken throughout the year, are vital tools for teachers to support student success. There are online resources to help parents and families support their student during CMAS testing, located at standards.dpsk12.org. If you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to me. COUNSELOR'S CORNER!

Strategies That Teach Kids To Set Goals And To Help Them Succeed!

- Define what a goal is. An easy way is to link it to an area of interest. For example, a football player
 is aiming for a touchdown. It is something to shoot for. Explain goal setting as planning what you
 need to work on.
- Share your own goals. Let your children know that you have dreams, and that you recognize that

you may need to work on some things in order to achieve them.

- Help kids create their "dream list". Help them create a list that includes those things that they
 actually have the power to make happen. Then spend time together discussing those dreams.
 Consider what skills are necessary. Does your child need help in order to succeed?
- Tailor the goal to your child. Have a first time goal-setter work on a goal that can be achieved
 within a week. Some examples are making their bed every day, reading a book, brushing teeth
 without being reminded, getting a strike in bowling.
- Help your child think through steps to success. Some children need to write down steps. The
 more they think about their goal, and identify what they need to do to achieve it, the greater the
 chance they will succeed.
- Track your child's progress. Use the fridge to show stickers or stars when steps are completed.
- Celebrate! As goals are achieved, celebrate as a family.
