— MESSAGE FROM — THE PRINCIPAL

Yesterday, DPS made the decision to shift all K-12 grades and programs to remote learning, beginning on Monday, Nov. 30 through the winter break, which is the end of the first semester. This includes, a shift to remote learning for special-education and newcomer center programs.

ECE families will receive supports for athome instruction, but we will not be offering full remote learning for ECE students.

This shift to remote learning will allow our teachers and students to work on consistent, uninterrupted class routines and focus their energy on the important work of learning.

We are committed to returning all elementary students at the start of second semester in January. We will also continue working with our health partners and our middle school leaders on the efforts to have our middle school students return to inperson learning as well, as soon as we can do so safely.

Rice is continuing to test students that are virtual in grades K, 2, and 6th as part of the district's universal testing (More Information may be found here in the Intent to test letter, you may copy and paste the link below to go to the website.

GET HELP PAYING YOUR BILLS, UP TO \$4000 FOR DENVER RESIDENTS WHO ARE IMPACTED BY COVID-19!

Denver Human Services is now offering up to \$4,000 (depending on need) of emergency/disaster assistance to those who qualify to support Denver residents in need who are negatively impacted by COVID-19 or lost their jobs as a result of COVID-19.

These payments can be used for a variety of reasons — to cover rent or pay the mortgage, to pay for mental or medical care, home or auto repairs, food or school supplies, and more. To qualify, you must be: A lawfully present Denver resident Have at least one dependent minor living at home Make less than \$75,000 Have a COVID-19-related emergency To apply, go to Colorado.gov/PEAK and apply for Colorado Works/TANF.
