### **COUNSELOR'S CORNER!**

#### Five suggestions for developing empathy in children:

- Empathize with your child and model how to feel compassion for others.
- Make caring for others a priority and set high ethical expectations.
- Provide opportunities for children to practice.
- Expand your child's circle of concern.
- Help children develop self-control and manage feelings effectively.

Even when kids feel empathy for others, societal pressures and prejudices can block their ability to express their concern. When kids are angry with each other over a perceived slight, for example, it can be a real challenge for them to engage their sense of empathy. Encourage kids to name those stereotypes and prejudices, and to talk about their anger, envy, shame and other negative emotions.

Model conflict resolution and anger management in your own actions, and let your kids see you work through challenging feelings in your own life.
